For anyone interested in writing drama for television or film, this evening is for you. Peter McKenna has written extensively for film, television and stage. Most recently, he created and acted as showrunner on *Red Rock*, a new soap for Irish broadcaster TV3, and alongside has continued his

writing services on The Musketeers for BBC1/BBC America.

Irish television credits include *On Home Ground* (Littlebird/RTÉ), *Fair City* (RTÉ), *Legend* (Ice Box/RTÉ) and *The Clinic* (Parallel Productions/RTÉ), where he was appointed Head Writer and Story Consultant.

In 2009, Peter received both an Irish Film & Television Academy (IFTA) nomination and Irish Screenwriters & Playwrights Guild Zebbie Award nomination for "Best Television Script". Peter has also written and directed two short films, *Bovine* and *Racing Homer*, which won the Irish Film Board "Short Cuts Award". And his critically acclaimed play *Missing Football* received the OZ Whitehead Award for Best Irish One Act Play.

Paul Lynch

Paul Lynch is the author of the critically lauded Irish novels *Red Sky in Morning* and *The Black Snow*, and has been nominated for France's Prix du Meilleur Livre Étranger (Best Foreign Book Prize) and the Prix du Premier Roman (First Novel Prize).

After a six-publisher bidding war, his debut novel *Red Sky in Morning* was published to critical acclaim on both sides of the Atlantic in 2013. It was an amazon.com Book of the Month, a Barnes & Noble Discover Great New Writers pick, a *Huffington Post* book of the week and *The Daily Beast's* Hot Read. It was featured on NPR's *All Things Considered*, where Lynch was hailed as "a lapidary young master". It was a book of the year in *The Irish Times, The Toronto Star*, the *Irish Independent* and the *Sunday Business Post*.

His second novel *The Black Snow* was published in 2014 in the UK and Ireland. It was hailed as "masterful" and "a considerable achievement" by *The Sunday Times*, "dazzling" by *The Sunday Business Post* and "powerful" by the *Irish Times*, which praised his ability to "reinvent the English language". It will be published in America by Little, Brown in Spring 2015. *Red Sky in Morning* was published in the French (Un ciel rouge, le matin) in March 2014 by Albin Michel to massive critical acclaim.

Paul was born in Limerick in 1977, grew up in Donegal, and is now living in Dublin. He was the chief film critic of *Ireland's Sunday Tribune* newspaper from 2007 to 2011 and has written regularly for *The Sunday Times* on film. He is now a full-time novelist.


